DESCRIPTION:

FULL TIME, NON-TENURE - Grays Harbor College is seeking a qualified forestry instructor to develop additional curriculum, teach courses, and manage partnerships for the Bachelor of Applied Science in Forest Resource Management (BAS-FRM).

Applicants should be familiar with the following: silviculture, hydrology and soils, international forestry, transportation system design, harvest systems: ground, cable and aerial based, resource economics, geographic information systems (GIS), use of new technologies in resource management and managing resources for new product development and production (e.g. CLT) and possess exceptional communication and time management skills.

This is a full-time, non tenure-track position. The placement on the salary schedule for 175 Day Contract will be determined by education and experience at the time of hire. - Collaborate with faculty at Green River College on curriculum delivery for their BAS-FRM
- Coordinate and collaborate with faculty to ensure seamless transition from the AAS in Natural Resources-Forestry Technician degree to the BAS-FRM
- Manage resources associated with BAS-FRM program
- Facilitate student learning with clear and effective presentations, demonstrations, and active learner involvement
- Provide regular opportunities for students to practice, perform, and receive feedback on all work
- Assess of student learning outcomes at the course and program level
- Provide applied student learning opportunities in the field.
- Facilitate student learning with a variety of methodologies: lecture, discussion, Socratic questioning, demonstration, assessment, etc.
- Employ strategies and techniques that address students' multiple learning styles
- Participate on college committees
- Facilitate student extra-curricular activities associated with the program

- Demonstrated successful teaching experience at the community college or baccalaureate level.
- Knowledge, skills and experience with multiculturalism and ethnic diversity.
