Summary:

To plan and supervise forest management activities in connection with the management of state owned lands and the monitoring of statewide forest resource plans for the Division of Forests and Lands, Department of Resources and Economic Development.

Responsibilities:

- Manages US Army Corps of Engineers land in three flood control areas as defined in DRED management license of these areas. Develops detailed annual reports describing accomplishments of each fiscal year including comprehensive account of expenditures, and submits detailed annual work plan including timber harvesting, wildlife habitat improvement, road and trail maintenance, and a three-year budget with revenue projections.
- Generates revenue, prepares biennial budgets and supervises expenditures to accomplish program objectives.
- Develops and maintains a GIS database of the three flood control properties.
- Coordinates activities, projects, and planning with the US Army Corps of Engineers and other state agencies.
- Develops and recommends long-term management guidelines for public lands using complex scientific data and principles.
- Supervises timber harvesting operations including prescribing silvicultural treatments, sale layout, timber marking, appraising harvest volumes and values and truck road layout; obtains cost estimates for outside personnel services and equipment and equipment use for the preparation of contracts, agreements and budgets, and monitors operations for contract compliance.
- Prepares public notices, planning reports, reports on new technology, and applications for public permits.

- Negotiates with private landowner for rights-of-way; collects, interprets and reports data for legal actions taken by the Division; monitors the inspection of boundary lines, access roads and trails, and recommends maintenance.
- Develops and assists in public educational programs such as the public showing of forest operations, special programs and expositions.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

Education:

- Associate's degree from a recognized college or university with major study in forestry, forest technology, horticulture, natural resources, or environmental conservation, or a related field.
- Each additional year of approved formal education may be substituted for one year of required work experience.

Experience:

- Five years of experience in forest management, forest nursery operations, forest insects and diseases, or arboriculture, one year of which shall have been in a supervisory capacity.

License/Certification:

- Must possess a valid driver's license.
- Must obtain a New Hampshire Professional Forester License (LPF) within one (1) year of hire.
