- Leading or facilitating a planning team;
- Policy issues related to natural resources;
- Soliciting public input for planning purposes;
- Developing performance measures or program evaluation systems;
- Leading strategic planning for a complex organization;
- Coaching leadership in planning principles.

This position plays a key role in establishing the strategic direction of the agency's Division of Forestry and ensuring that work plans and program performance align with this direction. The planner provides expertise for statewide planning involving forest ecosystems, forested properties and the DNR forestry program. This position has primary responsibility for ensuring consistent application of the principles of sustainable forestry in planning, the principles of continuous quality improvement in program management, and resulting policy development. The planner also provides leadership for the planning and evaluation process, and collaborates with senior leadership and stakeholder groups.
