**Required Education and Experience:** Minimum requirement of a Bachelor's Degree in a related field and 3 years of related experience or an equivalent combination of education and experience.

**Required Licenses or Certifications:** Ability to be certified and licensed to practice forestry in Connecticut, Vermont, New Hampshire and Maine.

**Qualifications:**

- Proven ability to inspire students through practical, hands-on teaching.
- Ability to guide and mentor master's professional students through a ten-week summertime apprentice forester fellowship program on managing forests based at the Yale-Myers Forest.
- Ability to mentor and administer a post-graduate fellowship program of recent graduate foresters who help to manage the School Forests and who engage in extension and education activities surrounding the School Forests.
- Interdisciplinary expertise focused on management of forests that includes road and trail engineering and design, harvesting operations, and conservation practices around protecting water, soils, and wildlife habitat. General knowledge of soils, forest ecology, silviculture, wildlife, dendrology, economics, finance, growth and yield, or combination of these subjects.
- Strong experience in the oversight and direct management of timber sales, marketing products, contracts; and the trespass, deeds, and legal issues of managing land. Must possess evidence of exceptional ability in field-based teaching, experience in research and an interest in coordinating student research in forest operations.
- **Preferred Education, Experience and Skills:** Doctoral degree in a forest related field, or equivalent practical experience.
- **Physical Requirements:** Capable of living in relatively remote forest areas for extended periods of time.
